


UNEMPLOYMENT DIGEST

The Information contained in this report is based on Claimant Count figures. The Claimant Count measures the number of people claiming benefits principally for the reason of being unemployed. The Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) introduced a new benefit, Universal Credit, in April 2013. At present Universal Credit benefit is not included in the Claimant Count figures. Office for National Statistics (ONS) and DWP are working to include jobseeker Universal Credit claims in the Claimant Count as soon as possible.

The December 2014 claimant count unemployment figures* were released on 21st January 2015.


As illustrated by the chart below, the Highlands and Islands continues to have significantly lower unemployment than either Scotland or the UK - a trend which has been fairly constant since the recession.



In December 2014, the average claimant count unemployment rate for the Travel to Work Areas (TTWAs) that comprise the Highlands and Islands was **1.4%**, which was below the rates for both Scotland **(2.3%)** and the UK **(2.0%)**. The region's rate was higher than the previous month but lower than a year earlier (2.1% in December 2013).

The TTWAs whose rates exceeded the Scottish average in December 2014 were Wick (2.8%); Dunoon & Bute (2.7%); Invergordon (2.5%) and Campbeltown (2.4%). Seven TTWAs in the Highlands and Islands had rates in December 2014 lower than 1.4% – Moray (1.3%); Ullapool & Gairloch and Mull & Islay (both with 1.0%); Inverness and Dingwall (0.9%); Orkney Islands (0.8%); Badenoch (0.7%) and Shetland Islands (0.5%).

The total number of people claiming unemployment benefit in the HIE area[^] in December 2014 was 4,206. Out of the total, some 1,490 were long term unemployed^{**} and 800 were claimants aged 18-24.

**¹ For the purpose of this analysis, long-term unemployment (LTU) is defined as 'all those who have been unemployed and claiming benefit for over 6 months'.
