## UNEMPLOYMENT DIGEST

The September 2013 claimant count unemployment figures were released on 16th October 2013.

As illustrated by the chart below, the Highlands and Islands continues to have significantly lower unemployment than either Scotland or the UK – a trend which has been fairly constant since the recession.




In September 2013, the average claimant count unemployment rate for the Travel to Work Areas (TTWAs) that comprise the Highlands and Islands was 1.9%, which was below the rates for both Scotland (3.3%) and the UK's (3.2%). The region's rate decreased from 2.2% in the previous month and was 21% lower than a year earlier (2.4% in September 2012).

The TTWAs whose rates exceeded the Scottish average in September 2013 were Wick (4.1%), Dunoon & Bute (3.7%) and Campbeltown (3.5%). Nine TTWAs in the Highlands and Islands had rates in September 2013 lower than 2% – Skye & Lochalsh (1.8%), Moray and Inverness & Dingwall (both 1.7%), Lochaber (1.6%), Ullapool & Gairloch (1.2%), Badenoch and Orkney Islands (both 1.1%), Mull & Islay (1.0%), and Shetland Islands (0.8%).

The total number of people claiming unemployment benefit in the HIE area<sup>^</sup> in September 2013 was 5,440. Out of the total, some 2,480 were long term unemployed<sup>\*\*</sup> and 1,175 were claimants aged 18-24.
